

Title:

"The association between calf muscle endurance and the incidence of foot and ankle injuries in male and female elite pre-professional ballet dancers; a 2 year longitudinal study"

We have put Erica forwards as she was the highest scoring student for the research project module – a module mark comprised of a study manuscript (moderated during a 30min viva with the student), presentation (at our annual scientific meeting) and supervisor report.

Erica's project was completed in collaboration with the English National Ballet School and involved data collection on-site at the school. Erica showed great commitment to the study and completed a project that demonstrated high levels of scientific merit.

With the development of first contact and advanced physiotherapy roles, patient safety is paramount and closely scrutinised. This includes safety netting, defined as the practice of providing information to patients about symptoms they should monitor and the action they should take if their condition worsens (Jones et al 2019).

This application is seeking funding for a discrete research project to identify safety netting practices in an existing dataset comprising audio-recordings and transcripts from 78 encounters between physiotherapists (band 5-8) and 40 patients with low back pain in an NHS primary care setting.
